INTRO TO ST ANN'S SYNODAL TEAM





The Parish Synodal Team at St. Ann's Catholic Church was formed to ensure **effective collaboration**, **engagement**, and participation among all key ministries.

This model integrates both the universal Parish General structure and the Call to Bear Fruit vision, reflecting the spirit of synodality within the church.

The team consists of 25 members, including:
Parish Priest, All Committee Leads, All Catechists
Senior Parishioner Couple (50+ years in the parish)
Young Enthusiastic Family (active in the parish)

Parish Synodal Team

To ensure efficient operation, the following committees have been formed:

- Parish Finance Committee
- o Parish Social Committee
- Parish Church Maintenance Committee
- Liturgical Committee
- o Sacramental Committee
- Welcome Team
- o Tea & Coffee Team
- o Altar Servers Team
- Sacristan Team
- Safeguarding Representative
- Event Management Committee
- Catering Committee





The Parish Synodal Team meets three times a year, with each meeting focusing on a specific aspect of parish life:

- February Reviewing Lenten and Easter plans
- June Upgrading church activities and planning for the next year's sacramental programmes
- October Reviewing Advent and Christmas plans

Each committee also holds its own meetings as required and can convene for urgent discussions when needed.

GUIDELINES FOR SYNODAL TEAM

The Roman Catholic Church has formally started implementing its decision to increasingly become a synodal Church. Synodality is the specific modus vivendi et operandi of the Church, the People of God, which reveals and gives substance to her being in communion, as all members journey together, gather in assembly, and take an active part in her evangelising mission.

Purpose and Role:

• Ensure that the parish's activities align with its vision, mission, and synodal priorities.

Responsibilities:

- Provide a forum for representatives from all parish groups to collaborate and share ideas.
- Discuss and propose initiatives that enhance parish life and community engagement.
- Provide input on the annual planner to reflect parish priorities.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of implemented initiatives.

Collaboration with Other Committees:

- Work with the Finance Committee to align financial planning with parish goals.
- Support the Catechetical Team in integrating faith formation into parish activities.
- Partner with the Social Committee to create community-building events.

Meetings: Held three times a year, typically in February, June, and October, with additional sessions for urgent matters.
