For thus says the LORD: 'Behold, I will extend peace to her like a river, and the glory of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse, you shall be carried upon her hip, and bounced upon her knees. As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice; your bones shall flourish like the grass; and the hand of the LORD shall be known to his servants.' The word of the Lord. R. Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm

Gospel Acclamation: Colossians 3:15a, 16a Alleluia, alleluia. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts; let the word of Christ dwell in you richly. Alleluia.

Gospel Luke 10:1-9

At that time: The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. And he said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no money bag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace be to this house!" And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick in it and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." 'The Gospel of the Lord. All reply: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Creed: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We are very excited to invite all of you to our **Parish Feast of St. Ann on Sunday**, **27th July (July 26: Feast day)**, which we will start with the celebration together at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. It will be a joyful day for our whole parish family. **After Mass**, **we will have a barbecue**, **drinks**, **raffle**, **singing**, **and dancing** - all organised by our Social Committee and Church Maintenance Team.

On this special day, we will also celebrate 5+ baptisms (10.00 am) and First Holy Communion for some parishioners, marking their new beginning in the Church.

Leading up to the feast, we will hold a three-day novena:

- Friday (7:00 p.m. Mass with adoration beforehand): Praying for expectant mothers in our families. As St Ann is the patron for expectant mothers.
- Saturday (6:00 p.m. Mass with half-hour adoration beforehand): Praying for grandchildren and young people as St Ann is the patron for grand Children.
- Sunday (Feast Day Mass): Praying for all families in the parish as St Ann is the patron for families.

We warmly encourage everyone to attend these novena Masses and especially the Feast Day celebration.
