"Exaltation of the Cross - Glory Through Humility"

Dear brothers and sisters,

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. At first glance the Cross is a symbol of shame and suffering, but in Christ it becomes the sign of glory and victory. St Paul reminds us: "He humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:8). The Cross teaches us that true greatness is not found in power or pride, but in humility and self-giving love.

In our daily lives we too are invited to embrace this way - to descend in humility so that, with Christ, we may ascend in glory. As Jesus said: "Whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Mt 23:12). The Cross is not only to be worn or displayed, but to be lived - in our families, our workplaces, and our parish community.

We also warmly congratulate **Anna Megan Ferncombe for being baptised** yesterday. God's blessings be upon her and her family as they continue their journey of faith. We also thank them for the beautiful flowers offered to St Ann's, which have brightened our church and lifted our worship.

## **Entrance Antiphon**

**Gal 6: 14:** We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First reading Numbers 21:4b-9

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. Pray to the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 78(77):1-2. 34-35. 36-37. 38. R cf. 7b

Response: Never forget the deeds of the Lord!

Give ear, my people, to my teaching; incline your ear to the words of my mouth.

I will open my mouth in a parable and utter hidden lessons of the past. R.

When he slew them, then they sought him, repented and earnestly sought God.

They would remember that God was their rock, God the Most High their redeemer. R.

Yet they deceived him with their mouths; they lied to him with their tongues. For their hearts were not steadfast towards him; they were not faithful to his covenant. **R**.

# Second reading

Philippians 2:6-11

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. **The word of the Lord. R. Thanks be to God.** 

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your Cross you have redeemed the world. Alleluia.

Gospel John 3:13-17

At that time: Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.' The Gospel of the Lord. All reply: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

## DOUBLE GLAZING PROJECT - APPEAL FOR SUPPORT
