For out of Sion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD. The word of the Lord. R. Thanks be to God.

Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ. Gospel Acclamation: Psalm 85(84):8

Alleluia, alleluia. Show us, O LORD, your mercy, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia..

Gospel Matthew 24:37-44

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: 'For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.' The Gospel of the Lord. All reply: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

#### **ADVENT - A SEASON OF WAITING AND WONDER**

Advent is the beautiful four-week journey that prepares our hearts for the coming of Christ. It begins with the quiet call of the prophets: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Isaiah 9:2). It is a season marked by hope – a place of solace – as we look towards the light that transforms every waiting.

During Advent, we are invited to slow down, to listen, and to make room for the Lord in our daily lives. St Augustine once said, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." Advent helps us make that inner space where Christ can dwell.

Each candle on the Advent wreath carries a message:

**Hope** – trusting that God walks with us

**Peace** – allowing Christ to calm our fears

Joy - rejoicing as Mary did in God's promise

**Love** – embracing the fullness of God's gift in Christ

As a parish, we walk this path together through our liturgies, prayers, and acts of kindness. It is a time to remember those who need our presence and compassion, and to prepare our homes and hearts for the birth of the Saviour. Let this Advent be a moment of renewal, expectation, and grace for every family in our parish.

## **LITURGICAL YEAR 2026**

**Understanding the Liturgical Year:** The Liturgical Year is the Church's sacred rhythm of worship, guiding us through the life of Christ – His birth, ministry, passion, resurrection, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is not simply a calendar; it is a spiritual journey that shapes our hearts in every season. The year is divided into key periods, each with its own colour, mood, and invitation:

Advent – Waiting and Expectation (Purple): The year begins with Advent, a quiet season of longing as we prepare for the coming of Christ. The readings and prayers call us to watchfulness and inner renewal.

Christmas Season – Light and Joy (White/Gold): From Christmas Day to the Baptism of the Lord, we celebrate the mystery of God becoming one of us. "The Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:14).

Ordinary Time - Growth and Discipleship (Green): This season comes twice in the year. It is the time when Jesus teaches, heals, and walks with His disciples. It is steady, gentle, and meant for spiritual growth. St Francis of Assisi said, "Start by doing what is

necessary, then what is possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible." Ordinary Time invites exactly that.

**Lent – Repentance and Conversion (Purple):** Forty days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent mirrors Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. It is a call to humility and renewal: "Return to me with all your heart" (Joel 2:12).

Holy Week – The Heart of the Mystery (Red/White): From Palm Sunday to Easter, we walk with Christ through His suffering, death, and glorious resurrection. These days are the centre of our faith.

Easter Season – Resurrection and New Life (White/Gold): For fifty days, we celebrate the victory of Christ over death. The season ends with Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, when the Church receives her mission.

Ordinary Time (Second Part) – Living the Mission (Green): After Pentecost, we enter the longest stretch of the year, marked by the daily living of the Gospel in our families, workplaces, and communities.

**Solemnities and Feasts:** Throughout the year, the Church honours key moments and saints who reveal God's grace in history – from the feasts of Our Lady to the apostles and great witnesses of faith.

Live our year in God's time, not just the world's time
